From the Pastor's Pen . . .

Well, it's that time of year again. What am I talking about? Not cooler weather, not the first frost, not All Saints Sunday, not the UMW Yard Sale, etc. Give up? Are you ready? Here goes. (I'll bet the anticipation is just about to kill you.) It is time for Englewood United Methodist Church to begin its Pledge Drive. Do I hear a big Hooray?

The Lord through Paul tells us in **2 Corinthians 9:6-8**: ***"The point is this: he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion [for God loves a cheerful giver]. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that you may always have enough of everything and may provide in abundance for every good work."***

You know the old adage, "You get what you pay for". This is kind of what Paul is saying here. There have been many times in my life when I should have spent just a little more on something (a shirt, a suit, a pair of shoes). I would have had something of better quality and it would have lasted longer. If I skimp on something, I'll probably miss out on something I could have really enjoyed for quite a while.

We can apply this so easily to the spiritual realm. Giving to enhance our spiritual lives and the spiritual lives of others is so important. We can give a little and most likely we and others will receive a little. But, we can give a lot and most likely we and others will receive a lot. In a sense, "We'll get what we pay for". In church-speak, the things that we followers of Jesus know about are things like the fruit of the Spirit found in **Galations 5:22**: ***"....love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control"***. When we give to the Lord Jesus, out of our love for Him, we can count on receiving the fruit of the Spirit and many more blessings found in God's Word. If we give nothing, we will probably receive very little love, joy, peace..... If we give sparingly, we run the risk of reaping sparingly these same blessings. But, if we give bountifully, we will receive bountiful blessings of the fruit of the Spirit and more. Paul himself says in **2 Corinthians 9:11**, ***"You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God"***.

Paul says that we should **"make up our mind"** when we consider how much to give. This of course means more than that of "putting on our thinking caps" in the secular vernacular. We are told in **1 Corinthians 2:16**: ***"We have the mind of Christ"***. In other words, as you and I spend time with Jesus in our daily devotional lives, we will think more and more what he thinks concerning any issue. Having the "mind of Jesus" requires intimate time spent with him as a member of each of our families.

As we spend more time with him, we will begin to understand what giving bountifully and cheerfully is all about. He is the "supreme example" of giving gladly and generously. Jesus gave his life (body and blood) for our forgiveness and our eternal life. By doing this, he knew that we would be able to live forever with him and our other loved ones who have gone before us and will come after us. **Talk about blessings! WOW!**

All of this is to say let's keep our eyes on Jesus and not on our preferences. One is eternal and the other is temporal. Let's use our minds that have been renewed by Jesus when we said yes to Him. **Romans 12:2 says: "....be transformed by the renewal of your minds"**. I am so glad that God did not say, "do as you feel", but instead **"make up your mind"**. After you have spent much time with Jesus in prayer and in His Word, make your cheerful and intentional decision on how much you will plan to give to the Lord Jesus and His church at EUMC. Then, stick to it as you are able. Of course, there are times when emergencies arise and you can't fulfill your desires. We all understand. "Been there, experienced that." However, if "things go smoothly", I know that each of us will attempt to be faithful to the Lord Jesus and his church in our monetary giving. May God bless you in and for your faithfulness.

They asked me if I had thought that maybe my wife might believe the same as me that exercise might shorten your life and that’s why she gets me out to exercise often! HUH!?! WHAT!?!?



I was bothered that someone would display that bumper sticker wanting to be missing. I would have been really concerned if they had also displayed at the same time “the sign of the fish” that we see so often on cars or some other “Christian symbol” (especially a EUMC sticker). Christian believers who study God’s word will never doubt their “value” as a special creation from God. And we would never want to miss, if only for a day, a relationship with Christ, and His love.

First of all, we were created by God and in the image of God. (Genesis 1:27 NIV). Second, just as Jeremiah whom God spoke saying, “Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you, before you were born, I set you apart” (Jeremiah 1:4 NIV). God knows and sets us apart. All believers who love Him have been called according to His purpose, which is to serve God and to serve others (Romans 8:28-30 NIV). Christ told several parables of just how valuable and important each person is to God and how God seeks to find and restore each believer. Luke, Chapter 15, tells the stories of the Lost Sheep, (leaving 99 to search for 1), the Lost Coin (rejoicing when the 1 coin is found), and the story of the (lost) Prodigal Son, (and the celebration upon his return). Christ tells us that our Father even knows when a sparrow falls and that we are worth more than many sparrows (Matthew 10:29-31 NIV).

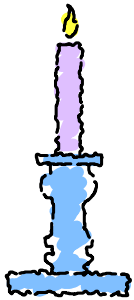

(Many who have the opportunity to serve at the Compassion Café or in local and global missions will tell you they get back so much more than they give to those in need. Some of those experiences will be shared in future newsletters as “Food for Thought”.)

During our service at Compassion Café our church is responsible for a short devotion. In August we talked about Exodus 3, the burning bush and God’s call to Moses.

A mother and son kept exchanging glances and smiling at each other during the devotion time. They later told me they had heard this Exodus 3 scripture three times that morning: once on TV, once on the radio and then again at the Café. The mom thought that was very unusual and the son smiling responded, “Maybe God is trying to talk to us”. I told them God is always talking to us, sometimes through His word, sometimes through other people, sometimes through our circumstances. The boy smiled and seemed encouraged at God’s word for him that day. One unusual morning and three different circumstances focused their attention on God’s message.

God has a way of doing that....if we just listen.

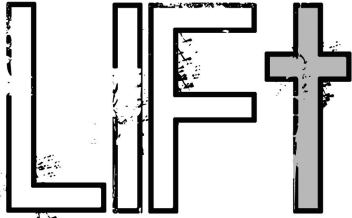


OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

NEW NURSERY

Ages 0-Young Twos (do not turn two by August 31)

Crib/Crawler Nursery - This nursery is located immediately on the left as you come into the children's wing. Your babies will be nurtured in a peaceful environment by staff and volunteers during both morning worship services and Sunday School.

Older Twos - Young Fours (do not turn four by August 31)

Toddler Nursery - Located next door the Crib/Crawler Nursery, this nursery is supervised by staff and volunteers. Your toddlers will have time to play with age appropriate toys that stimulate their imaginations. Beginning in October, we will have teachers come into the room during Sunday School time and teach age appropriate lessons. This is offered for both morning worship times and during Sunday School.

Older Fours - Young Fives (do not turn five by August 31)

Pre-K Sunday School Class - Taught by Beth Ezzell, this class introduces your child to Bible stories and teaches them about the love of Jesus. Though your child is now too old to play in either of the nurseries during Church we offer a children's church program during our 8:30 service. On non-communion Sundays, children (ages 5-7) will be signed in at the narthex and will dismiss for children's church following the special time with children. They will be picked up following worship in the children's wing. Beginning in October, this option will be made available at our 11:00 service as well.

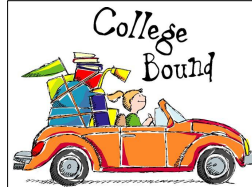
